I agree with the other reviewer, there is indeed two sides to a story and I am quite certain this book only sheds light on one version. The editing isn't polished and some sections seem jerky. As if she wants to say more but then thought the better of it and decided to leave things as they are. This book is overflowing with emotion which sometimes comes across as confusing. The anger she feels towards her son is somewhat tinged with sorrow at how things have turned out for him; and between themselves. Unfortunately, this book doesn't really provide that - nothing worthwhile anyway. Instead, this book appears to have been written by a VERY bitter mother with a huge axe to grind. According to his mom (the author), Dana & her were very close most of their lives. Then when he became successful with the UFC, he turned into the devil she always thought he was, and abandoned his family and friends. I'm not exaggerating either - this lovely woman told of the day she gave birth to Dana and how she looked into his eyes and thought they were "soulless". Even if it was well written & interesting, it's only approx 130 pages with large font, so hardly worth the cost to begin with.

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
