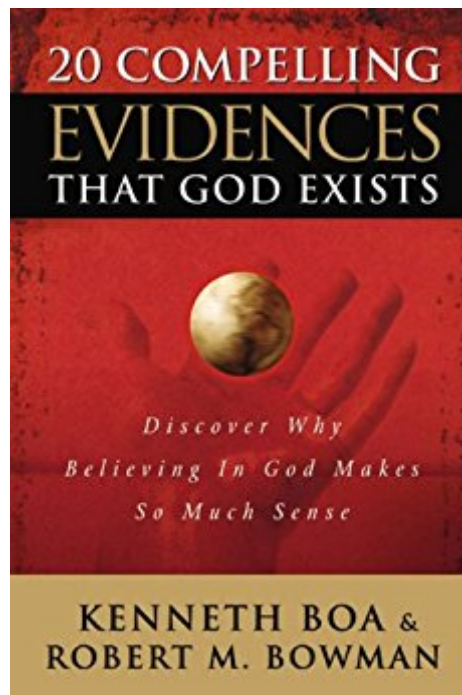

I would consider this book to be a great starting point for studying apologetics (the study and defense of the Divine origin and authority of Christianity). The authors, both strong academics, disseminate large amounts of information, and make it very understandable for anyone who reads this. In addition to this, they offer other books at the end of each chapter, for further study. They also offer a study guide at the end, and very thorough footnotes. This is a book that ALL Christians should read, as it gives a very clear argument for the faith we profess. Additionally, this would make a great book to use as a study guide for a small group. I highly recommend this book!

Any person who likes to think intellectually, who might enjoy the occasional philosophical debate or just likes to dig into deeper thoughts would be well advised to read this book. It is very well arranged with thought provoking presentations of in-depth philosophical arguments to challenge the most skeptical of people.

It's an adequate book if you're already a Christian and simply looking for arguments with which to further confirm and insulate your faith. However, if you're an unbeliever and you have well thought out and rational reasons for your unbelief, I seriously doubt that you will find anything here that is intellectually destabilizing enough to convince you that your unbelief is unjustified.

It was good yes, but not easy to read. This one was more for the scholarly also. It does have a lot of figures, some that I can't even count to. Some things to be honest was a bit over my head and would be for the vast majority. If you are an unbeliever or an atheist, then this book would make a good read though, it has all the science you love to refer to and much of it rather than refuting the biblical

claim enhances it. Try it out you might just like it.

Kenneth Boa and Robert Bowman hit a homerun in this practical apologetic book that everyone can read and gain insight from.
