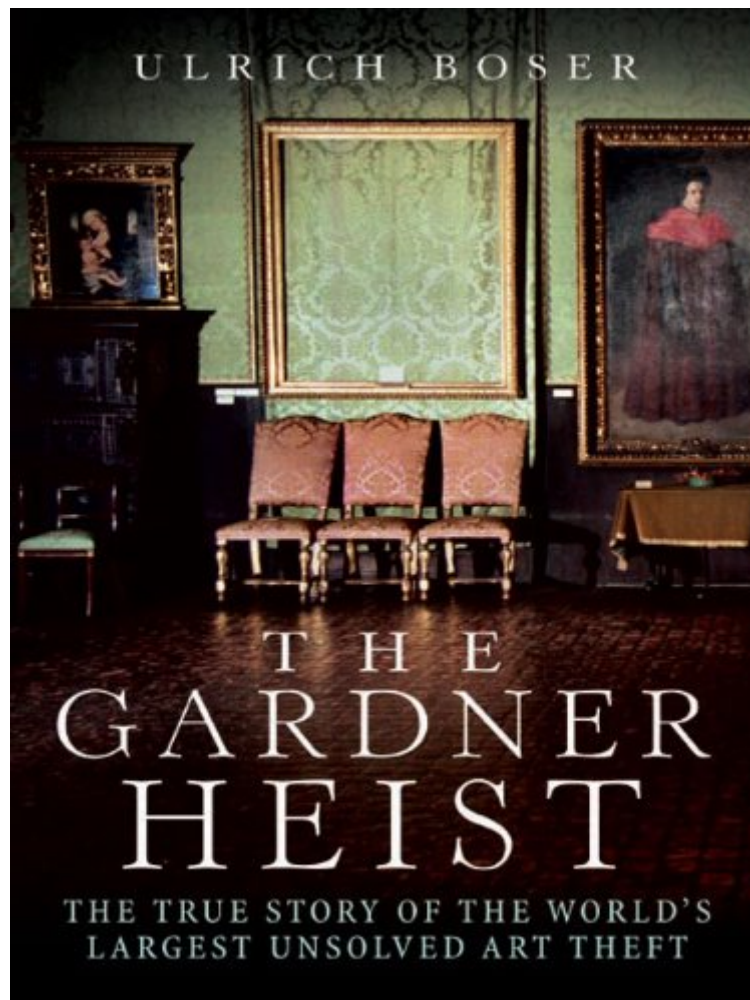




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The Gardner Heist: The True Story Of The World's Largest Unsolved Art Theft
