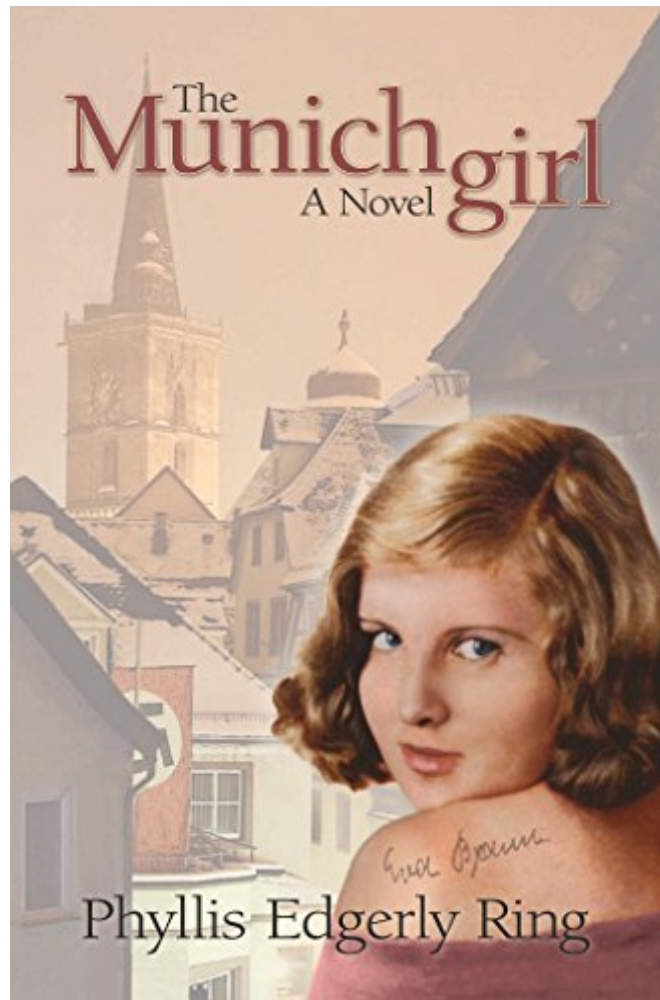

Synopsis

I didn't think I would like this book when I read what it was about. And I will admit that I felt somewhat uncomfortable while reading it from time to time because I was actually fascinated with it and enjoying it--but how could I? It was about Adolf Hitler's mistress/wife. Aren't we supposed to hate her? Hate all things Hitler? And I still can't say that I understand Ava Braun, nor would I praise her, but then neither does the author. Once again, human nature is a very complex thing to understand. I was hooked from the first page. It's very well-written, and I thoroughly enjoyed the background story of a middle aged woman who finds out that her mother was a friend of Ava Braun, and needs to know more. The love story is comfortable and perhaps a little predictable, yet I was not bored by it or frustrated. This is a very good book. And anyone interested in World War II history--and what life was like for the Germans after the war--would find it interesting. I highly recommend it.

Over the years many books about WWII have landed in my lap. I thought there couldn't possibly be another avenue to look at this war. Until now. This is a hard-to-put-down book, giving another viewpoint of the well-known, but not much known about person, Hitler's wife, Eva Braun. (She is rarely, if ever, referred to as his wife.) Yet, she is only a small part of the story, the part entwined with Anna and her mother, the every day part that we all live. The story blends those who were inside Germany, but not followers of Hitler, and the Allies who came from outside Germany to defeat him. There is so much going on in this fictional story that reads like it is true, probably because of all the detailed research the author conducted and the personal feeling she brings to the page. There are surprises to unwrap. Nothing is predictable, which makes the story even better. I LOVE THIS BOOK! And it's a book that I will re-read.

Having read a lot of historical fiction of World War Two, this is the first I have run across that features Eva Braun. Of course there is a lot of fictional content, Anna, who has traveled to Germany, realizes her mother knew Eva. At the same time the content regarding Eva seems well researched. The book is well written and I found it hard to put down.

Phyllis Edgerly Ring's writings are meaningful and memorable. My only caution is once you start THE MUNICH GIRL, you may not be able to put the book down. Synchronicity refers to meaningful coincidences. Such coincidences are mystical yet readily recognizable. One aspect of this historical novel is the suspense generated by what physician and depth psychologist Carl Jung called "the tension of opposites" makes the story a real page-turner. Biography, even when intentionally partly fictional, is the most popular form of history.
