Born February 2, 1905, Ayn Rand published her first novel, *We the Living*, in 1936. *Anthem* followed in 1938. It was with the publication of *The Fountainhead* (1943) and *Atlas Shrugged* (1957) that she achieved her spectacular success. Rand's unique philosophy, Objectivism, has gained a worldwide audience. The fundamentals of her philosophy are put forth in three nonfiction books, *Introduction to Objectivist Epistemology*, *The Virtues of Selfishness*, and *Capitalism: The Unknown*

Ideal. They are all available in Signet editions, as is the magnificent statement of her artistic credo, The Romantic Manifesto.

This is a fabulous collection of philosophical excerpts from Ayn Rand's three famous works. It contains key philosophical passages from WE THE LIVING, FOUNTAINHEAD and ATLAS SHRUGGED. It is a "manifesto" to use her words, that outlines her later Objectivist writings. Thrilling to read, it felt like Ayn Rand was speaking directly to me in private. Perfectly lovely...

The title essay is a must read for any individual who understands, supports, and desires to spread the word about Objectivism. The remainder of the book are key excerpts from all of Rand's fictional novels that outline some key ideas or specific takes on vital concepts that she writes on in her fiction.
