

The book includes practical advice on construction and period detail, from inserting gussets and split buskin insertion to eyelets and flossing. This is a high-level overview of corsets through the centuries. It starts early 1700s and goes through until the 1920s. It has patterns that you can scale up for all corsets inside and it has generalized tips and tricks for construction as well as a brief overview of history. This book arrived in a timely manner and in good condition. As to the contents of the text, I couldn't be happier!! I'm currently a student, but outside of classes I love to research and when time permits, recreate historical clothing. This book contains a variety of corset patterns and information from the 18th century to the early 20th century. The information included with each corset and the tips for recreating them is also invaluable to the writing. I would definitely recommend this to someone interested in historical corsets and/or the creation of such garments.

The book explains everything one needs to know, however it is better if the person knows how to sew, had at least one flat pattern or draping class. The graph helped me in terms of measuring, along with the hints on sewing/designing the garments. I just happen to have the same grid paper shown on each page. The fingers on the corset on page 31 was very helpful. I ordered a short busk, about 6 inches for my smaller waist corset, and experimented with the garders. Your instructions about flossing as a decorative stitch is a nice touch, and your instructions were clear and understandable. I must try those!! I cut my binding on the bias, because this gives me better control when I sew it on using tiny stitches. The smaller stitches work better using "between" needles. I am willing to find a commercial twill-weave that will work for me to accommodate the tiny needles. The book is simply beautiful with a whole lot of information!!

The patterns in this book are pieces of art. The book shows the finishings, the techniques in each corset and say sometihng about the making, but it's not a book for beginners. Anyone who wants to reproduce those corsets must have some knowledge about corset making beforehand. This book makes me want to build a corset right now! The pictures inside are very nice, and the reading was easy. The patterns are easy to copy too. And the instructions seems easy to follow. The only thing I

think it must be changed is the cover: it must be hardcover!! Today this book comes in brochure, but it's content is so rich that it must come in hardcover in the next editions.

Great book for those that want to learn corsetry. This book contains many example of historical corsets starting in the 18th century. Along with having history, it also highlights construction techniques and has patterns for most of the corsets shown, including the one pictured on the front page. It also an appendix with 2 projects. You do need to be an experienced sewer to make the best use of this book however. The only reason I'm not giving this book 4 stars is because the print quality is bad on the last 15 pages or so.
