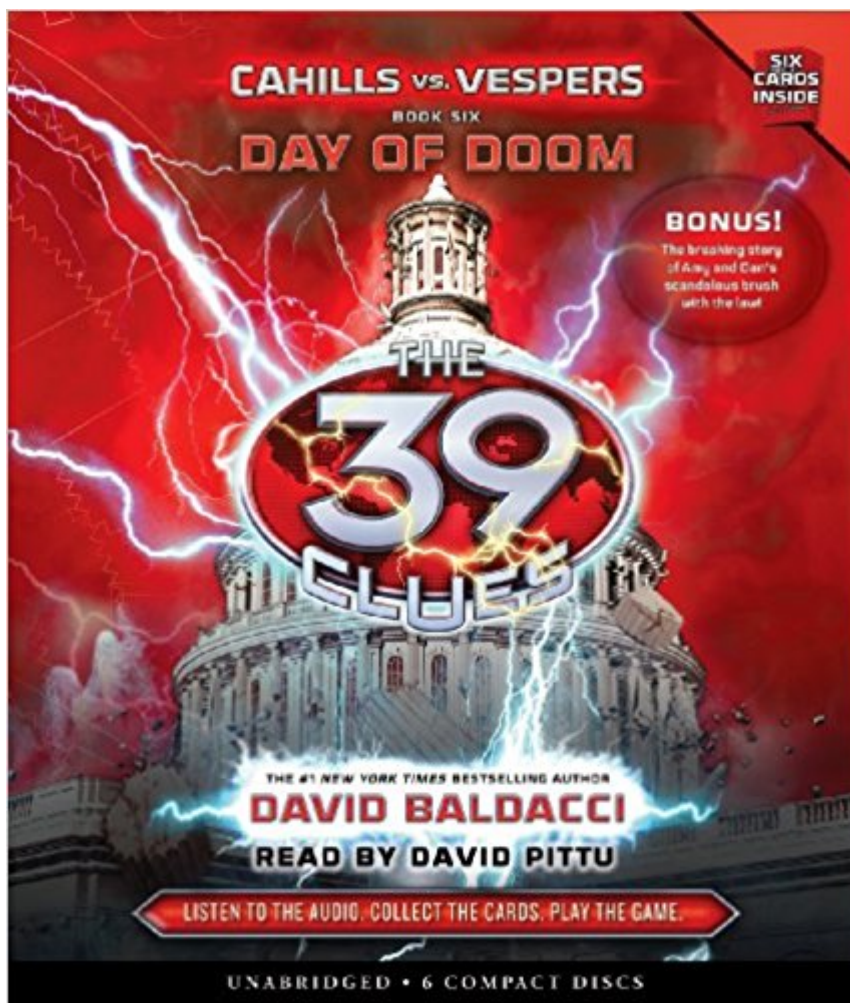


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The 39 Clues: Cahills Vs. Vespers Book 6: Day Of Doom - Audio

This last book in the Cahill/Vesper series was such a HUGE disappointment! As I read this one, I kept 'falling out of the dream' because of the silly dialogue, huge plot gaps, characters' illogical or unbelievable actions, and the author's overly obvious attempts to make this sound like a 'tween/young adult' book (including bodily function humor. I mean...seriously!?!). There was even a bit of crude language in this one, which was never an issue in the other 15 Cahill books. I seriously wonder if the author even read any of the previous books. If so, he certainly was unable to capture the 'voice' of most of the characters. It actually became a chore to finish this book, which was really frustrating since we had been so looking forward to its release. So bummed. Scholastic definitely mailed it in on this one.

What kind of book is this? Dan says 'freaking' so many times. There were so many loose ends... and come on, a doomsday device? Really? So clinched. Water filling up the room or poisoning someone? Clearly clinched. Dan is so sarcastic, Amy and Jake are acting like a cute couple, and Atticus is so serious. Ian, Jonah, Hamilton, and Evan are undeveloped. Ian is so gullible. Hamilton is so soft. How come Vikram Kabra wasn't in the story? If you ask me, he was a pretty important character as he shaped Ian's life. That definitely was a loose end. Borrow the book from the library because buying it is a waste of money. I hope Jude Watson can pull it off with unstoppable.

Lots of action, horrible, horrible writing. If I didn't know Baldacci had a number of published books to his credit, I wouldn't have guessed it from reading this one. I want to read it to find out what happens, but the klunky sentences and flat dialogue keep pulling me out of the story - they might have bothered me less when I was 11 or so, the age the book is aimed at, but I'm pretty sure I'd still have been annoyed.

This is possibly the worst book I have ever read. I enjoyed the series and to have it end so terribly was very disappointing. Amy lost her intelligence. Jonah annoyed everyone by trying to sing at the worst times - where did that come from? And the weird dream ending was nauseating. Don't buy this, don't even get it from the library. Scholastic ought to get one of the other authors in the series to write the true ending. Did they not get an outline or rough draft? Did Baldacci even read the other

books?

As a teacher, I am constantly looking for some GOOD books to share with my students.... The first set of books (11 of them) were AWESOME!!!! I was so excited that FINALLY there were books I could tell my students to "put on their Christmas list" ... Now for the second set, Cahills vs. Vespers (6 book set) was such a disappointment!!! TOTALLY.... so much so, that I am sending them back to the authors!!!! WAY too much violence.... too much blood..... too much junk that I would not want my students to read! ... shame on the authors!

What a disappointing end to a rollicking series. Our favorite characters have been turned into flat cartoons of themselves, losing the unique complexity that made this series interesting. Yes, all the drama is resolved into a nice neat package, and some characters are redeemed, but I recommend reading this only for resolving the last bits of unanswered questions. And be prepared for smarmy dialog (smarmier than usual), one-dimensional character structure, and a complete lack of respect for the reader's intelligence.

I was surprised when I started reading this book. I have read many of Baldacci's books and have enjoyed them all until I started this one. His main characters are brother and sister, one 16 and the other 13, most of the others are juveniles also. The story has them acting like adults both mentally and physically with superhuman abilities. I suppose that this is a good book for teenagers but I didn't care much for it. I almost quit reading it after the first few chapters but I did finish it. I was not aware of the series "39 Clues" until I saw them displayed at the end of this book. I will not buy any more of them.
