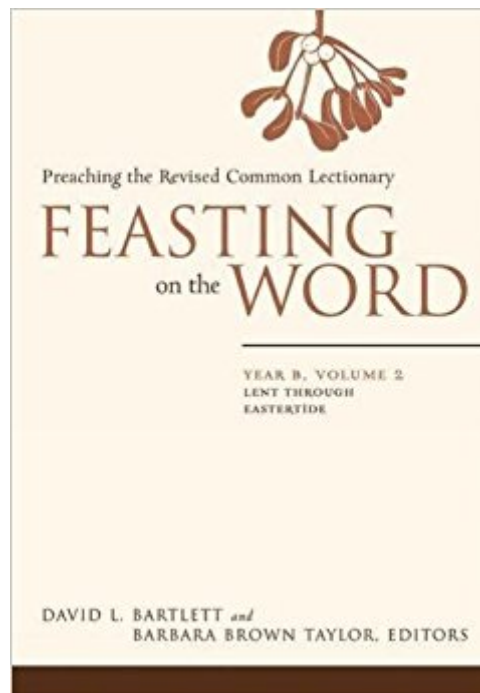




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Feasting On The Word: Preaching The Revised Common Lectionary, Year B, Vol. 2



Synopsis

With this new lectionary commentary series, Westminster John Knox offers the most extensive resource for preaching on the market today. When complete, the twelve volumes of the series will cover all the Sundays in the three-year lectionary cycle, along with movable occasions, such as Christmas Day, Epiphany, Holy Week, and All Saints' Day. For each lectionary text, preachers will find four brief essays--one each on the theological, pastoral, exegetical, and homiletical challenges of the text. This gives preachers sixteen different approaches to the proclamation of the Word on any given occasion. The editors and contributors to this series are world-class scholars, pastors, and writers representing a variety of denominations and traditions. And while the twelve volumes of the series will follow the pattern of the Revised Common Lectionary, each volume will contain an index of biblical passages so that nonlectionary preachers, as well as teachers and students, may make use of its contents.

I recently moved and am still unpacking boxes of books. In fact, it cost me a great deal to pay for shipping all of my wonderful books! So when I began to purchase these for my library, I decided to try them on the Kindle App for my iPad. The first one I purchased was *Feasting on the Word: Year B, Volume 1, Advent through Transfiguration*. I love the way these are put together, with various perspectives on the text. So how does it work in Kindle? Perfectly! The contents not only have links to the dates, but have links to the passages themselves. I keep my iPad with me and can do my research in waiting rooms, on trips, anywhere I have a few minutes to read. These have always been an excellent resource, so if you are trying to decide if these would work for you digitally, this is one pastor who votes a resounding YES! Not only are they convenient, they don't take up any space on my already overcrowded shelves.

As an ordained clergy member of the Episcopal Church I have found this series to be very valuable. I don't always use them but I do read them each week just to look at different viewpoints, some weeks are better than others but that would be expected. I also lead a "Pub Theology" group where we discuss the upcoming week's Gospel, and that is where I really fall back on these books for discussion points if the conversation ever gets slow. I highly recommend the entire series, either in print or e-versions.

Love these commentaries and kindle version shows well. Only problem is that the Year A,B,C and Volume number are near impossible to read on the cover view which makes finding which one you need quite the annoying task.
