

Great book, a very basic start to teaching children that differences in appearance do not separate us.

Great book to teach kids how our differences make us awesome. Has a page for how our \_\_\_\_ is different with close ups of illustrated examples of the varieties of that feature (including Sesame

Street characters). Then the next page shows how, in the big picture, all our \_\_\_\_ is really the same. For example, it has a page of "Our noses are different" with at least a dozen pictures of different noses. Then the next page has a big illustration of people outside with "Our noses are the same. They help us breathe, smell, sniff, and sneeze" (or some such...don't have it with me right now). I love that I can point out the particular features that are like my son's or mine or his dad's (we are a transracial family). The end talks about how boring things would be if we were all the same. Great book.

This is a great book for toddlers starring the Sesame Street characters about race and difference. It emphasizes that although we have different types of hair/skin/noses, etc. they all do the same things.

My nice enjoys books a LOT. She understands this book and likes the characters and people.

My kids love reading this book and it teaches good morals.

My son loves this book - age 3. Great diversity and inclusion book to teach kids early.

Having grown up on Sesame Street, I wanted to share some of that messaging with my nephew, who is mixed-race. Both he and his mom enjoyed reading the book together, and it led to some good discussions about him and his friends -- their similarities and differences.
