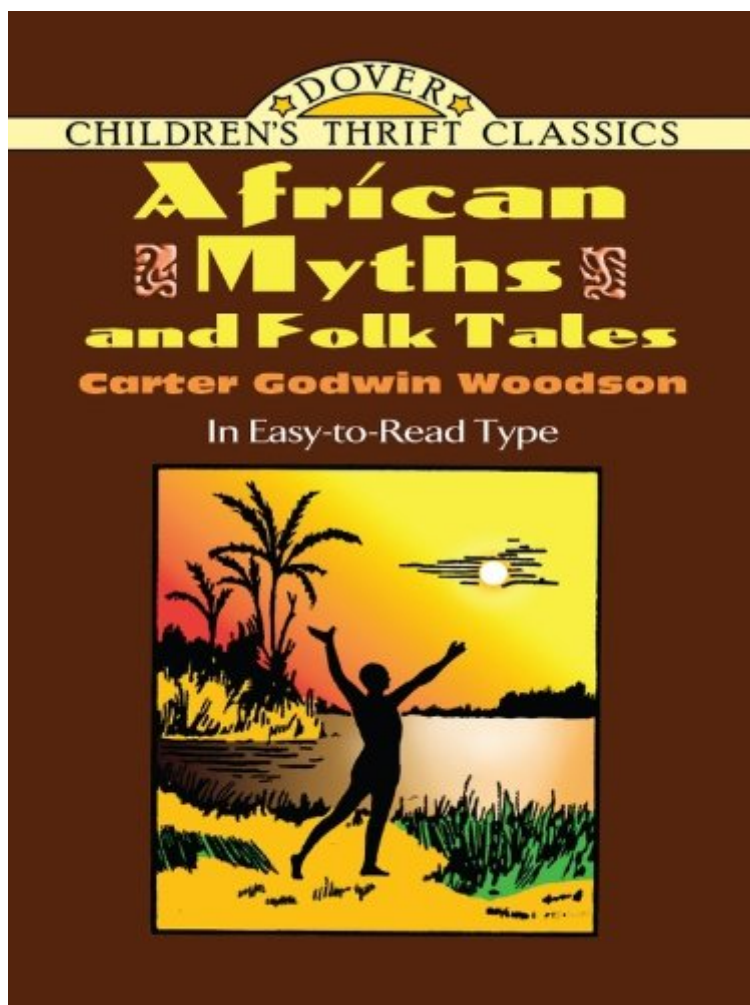

This book brings together a series of stories in which african animals have a series of misadventures according to their nature and character. The tales are simplistic but they have their charm. If you enjoy rudyard kipling you will most likely enjoy these.

Since this book has the words "Children's Thrift editions," don't be fooled. This book is perhaps better appreciated by the adult reader. Dr. Carter G. Woodson (father of Black History month) strongly believed in the use of folklore in the understanding of a people, and of the intelligence of the native-born African. In 1928, Woodson published this book at a time when few laypeople thought much of African (and African-American by extension) intellect. This book has a number of fascinating African tales, most with morals and additional proverbs. It makes for an entertaining and educational read. This gives you a good idea of the kind of griot's (African storytellers and oral historians') tales that were the ancestors of the Brer Rabbit stories (a number of the fables here involve hares) and unintentional cousins of Aesop. A good budget read for an airline flight or long trip where you don't have to drive. Also good for a relaxing afternoon on the front porch.
