

If you've never stopped to think about the treatment of the mentally ill, this book will surprise and shock you. A well documented exploration into the social and institutional constructs that systematically seek to label and then remove the rights of individuals. While this book does not set out to be critical of the mental health system, through simple analysis of the facts as they stand, this book is a disturbing account of the vested interests at play in the treatment of the mentally ill. The authors have provided compelling evidence of the continuing ignorance that pervades our views of the mentally ill, but also worryingly our definitions and expectations of happiness, and how we could all, so easily, be classified with some form of mental illness, save for the protection of 'class'.
